

Recreational Pilot Permit (RPP)

Requirements

- Minimum 16 years of age (14 for first solo)
- Valid Category 1, 3 or 4 Medical Certificate
- Completed WWFC Customer Application
- Completed WWFC Rules & Regulations Package

Knowledge

An applicant shall have obtained a minimum of 60% on the written examination Pilot Permit - Recreational - Aeroplane (RPPAE), or Private Pilot Licence - Aeroplane (PPAER). While ground school instruction is not a requirement for this permit, it is highly recommended to assist in the completion of the written examination. Study and reference guide are available at:

Experience

An applicant shall have completed a minimum of:

- 25 hours flight time, including a minimum of:
 - 15 hours dual instruction flight time, including a minimum of two hours cross-country flight time
 - Five hours solo flight time

Skill

An applicant shall successfully complete a flight test to the standard outlined in the Flight Test Standard - Recreational Pilot Permit - Aeroplane (TP12475E):

Privileges

The holder of a Recreational Pilot Permit – Aeroplane, may act as:

- Pilot-in-command of a single-engine aeroplane designed to carry a maximum of four passengers, with no more than one passenger carried on board, under Day VFR conditions in Canadian Airspace, and;
- Pilot-in-command of an ultra-light aeroplane.
