

Instrument Proficiency Check

This program does not require approval under the Ontario Career Colleges Act, 2005

Requirements

- Valid PPL, CPL or ATPL
- Valid Category 1 Medical Certificate
- Completed WWFC Customer Application
- Completed WWFC Rules and Regulations Package

Knowledge

An applicant for an IPC shall have flown within the previous 24 months (about 2 years) under IFR rules and come to the dual lessons having a reasonable understanding of IFR operation knowledge as demonstrated during the initial Group 1, 2, or 3 initial flight tests. As the initial IPC requires no letter of recommendation from a flight instructor, it must be understood that applicants provide a self-assessed timeline of how long it will take to be ready for the Transport Canada examination. An applicant shall complete 1-4 dual simulator flights in either our Alsim or Alsim 250. No minimum or maximum time is allocated towards this service, only as much as the applicant requires.

Skill

An applicant shall successfully complete a flight test to the standard outlined in the Flight Test Guide – Instrument Rating Groups 1, 2, 3 – Aeroplane - (TP9939E) available
